

Nora Lustig is Professor in the Office of the President at El Colegio de Mexico and Professor Emerita of Economics at Tulane University, where she is the founding director of the Commitment to Equity (CEQ) Institute. She is internationally recognized for her research on income distribution, poverty, inequality, and the redistributive impact of fiscal policy, especially in Latin America. She received her PhD in Economics from the University of California, Berkeley, and has held academic and policy positions at El Colegio de México, the Brookings Institution, the Inter-American Development Bank, the United Nations Development Program, and Tulane University. Lustig has been a visiting professor at MIT, the University of California, Berkeley, George Washington University, and the Paris School of Economics. She is the author, co-author, or editor of numerous books and scholarly articles, including the two-volume *Commitment to Equity Handbook: Estimating the Impact of Fiscal Policy on Inequality and Poverty* (Brookings Institution Press, 2022). Her work is widely cited and has influenced both academic research and public policy. Lustig has served on high-level international commissions and advisory bodies, and is a member of the Mexican Academy of Sciences and a recipient of several distinctions for her contributions to economics and public policy.
