

[Nora Lustig](#) is Samuel Z. Stone Professor of Latin American Economics and the founding Director of the [Commitment to Equity Institute](#) (CEQ) at Tulane University and resident fellow with the Georgetown University Americas Institute. She is also a Nonresident Senior Fellow at the [Brookings Institution](#), the [Center for Global Development](#), the [Inter-American Dialogue](#), and the [Paris School of Economics](#). Professor Lustig's research is on economic development, inequality, and social policies with emphasis on Latin America. Her recent publication *[Commitment to Equity Handbook: Estimating the Impact of Fiscal Policy on Inequality and Poverty](#)* is a step-by-step guide to assessing the impact of taxation and social spending on inequality and poverty in developing countries. Prof. Lustig is the President of the [Society for the Study of Economic Inequality](#) (ECINEQ) and President Emeritus of the Latin American and Caribbean Economic Association ([LACEA](#)). She serves on the editorial board of the [Journal of Economic Inequality](#). In November 2021, she was recognized with the Tulane University Innovation Award. She received her doctorate in Economics from the University of California, Berkeley.
